## Services

I am a scholar or part of a research team with experience receiving competitive research funding and have written a full proposal draft



### STANDARD GRANT REVIEW

- Academic review of content
- Language edit of abstract, timeline, and proposal (up to 15 pages)
- Review of subject area terminology

## STANDARD GRANT REVIEW 5 STEPS TO A WINNING GRANT

### 1 Project upload

When you are ready for us to begin reviewing your grant proposal, upload your draft via our secure web portal. One of our managing editors will review it carefully and send you a price quote and timeline, for your review and approval.

### 2 Initial consultation with your grant reviewer

Meet your grant reviewer over the phone or Zoom. The reviewer is familiar with your general field and with the funding body. Tell them about your research and the funding body you have chosen, clarifying your specific requests and needs so they can take this into account while reviewing the proposal.

### 3 Academic review

Your grant reviewer will conduct a thorough review of your proposal to identify strengths and weaknesses, and sections that may need improvement. We will give you concrete ideas for how to close the gap between your draft and the intended funding body to give your proposal the best chance of success. This includes making sure you clearly articulate your research questions and the gap in the field, confirming that your methodology is sound, demonstrating impact, and clarifying reasons why your research justifies external funding.

### 4 Client revisions

After we complete our initial review, you will be able to review our comments and decide what changes you want to implement and how you want to revise your work. Our feedback is intended to enable you to sharpen the scientific argument and offer a compelling articulation of the contribution and impact you plan to make.

### 5 Final review and language edit

# How It Works

### 5 STEPS TO A WINNING GRANT

#### 1 Project upload

Upload a 3-5 page abstract, including (a) the research question (b) why the questions are important, a brief literature review, and expected contribution (c) hypotheses (d) proposed methodology and why was it selected (e) steps to conduct the research. Choose the preferred expertise of your grant reviewer, and one of our managing editors will send you a price quote and timeline.

#### 2 Initial feedback and guidance

Once your grant reviewer has familiarized themselves with your detailed abstract, we will set a time for you to meet them over the phone or Zoom. During this consultation, you will discuss your particular questions or challenges, and receive direction, feedback, and specific input from the reviewer on how to move forward in completing your initial draft.

#### 3 Full proposal review

Once you finish a full draft of your proposal, your grant reviewer will conduct a thorough review to identify strengths and weaknesses, and sections that may still need improvement. We will give you concrete ideas for how to close the gap between your draft and the intended funding body to give your proposal the best chance of success.

#### 4 Client revisions

Following the full review, you will be able to review our comments and decide what changes you want to implement and how you want to revise your work. 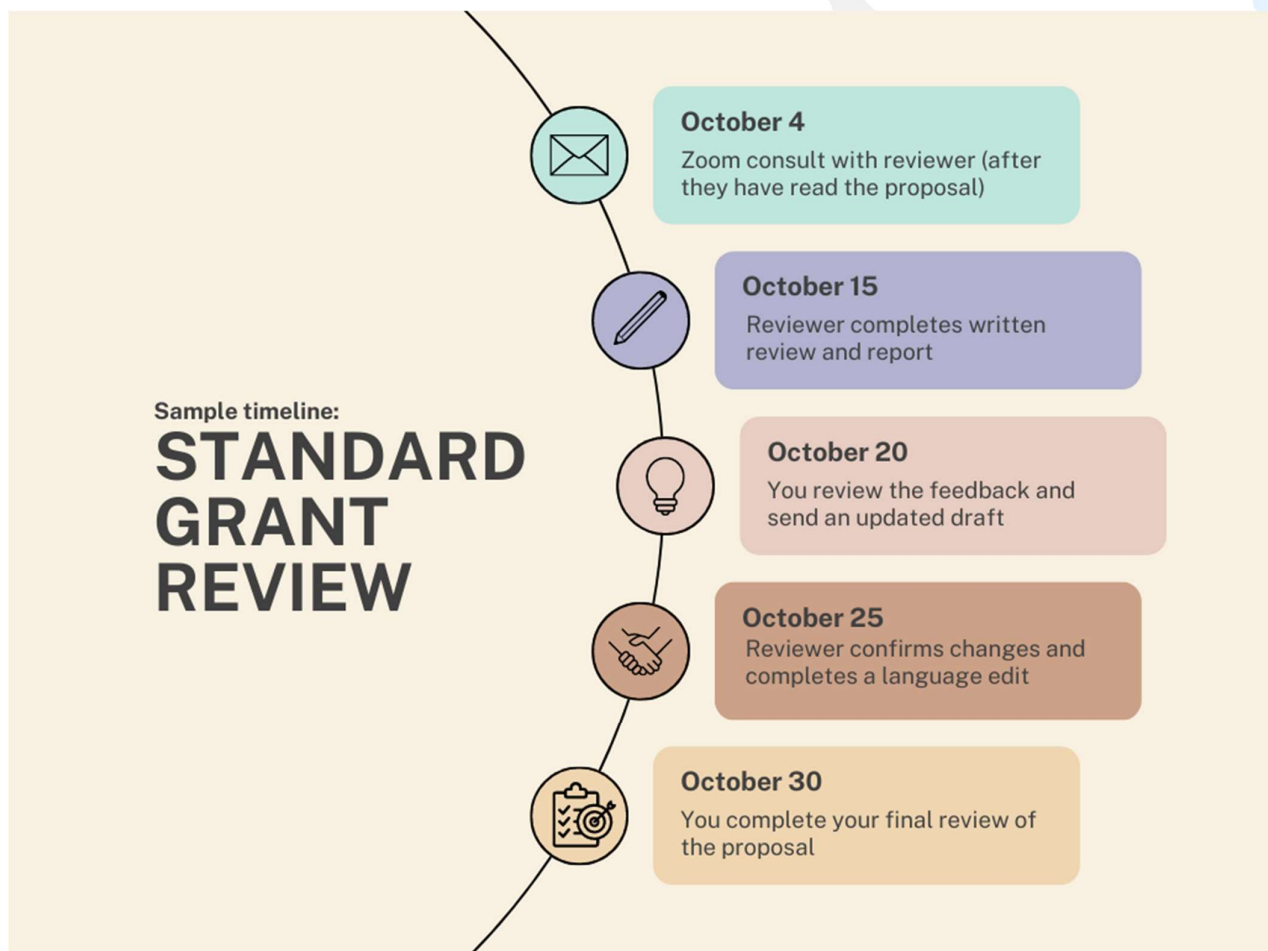
#### 5 Final review and language edit

Once you have revised your work as you see fit, we will undertake a comprehensive final review to ensure that your proposal is ready to be sent off to the funding body. This includes a full language edit to ensure that the proposal is written in polished, professional academic style - the kind of proposal that will compete with other top scholars from around the world. You will then be able to submit the proposal with the confidence that it will be seriously considered by the granting body.

- Standard Grant Review - *At least 4 weeks*
- Advanced Grant Review - *At least 8 weeks*
- Language Editing - *At least 1.5 weeks*
- Academic Review - *At least 2.5 weeks*

*\*All times are prior to university submission deadline and not the grant funding deadline*

The timelines below offer an example for how the process might proceed. Actual dates will vary depending on the individual project and the grant deadline.

## RUSH PROJECTS

Working according to our recommended timeline allows you to be matched with the expert that is best for you and to have a productive back and forth with them, in order to reach the best possible outcome for your proposal. If you are unable to begin your work with us within the recommended time frame, we do provide a rush option in special circumstances, that is charged at a higher rate, and may not allow for multiple rounds of revision.

### Standard Grant Review - RUSH

If we receive your proposal between 14 and 21 days before your deadline, we can complete a Standard Grant Review at a rush rate (\$1,270).

### Academic review or language editing alone - RUSH

If we receive your proposal between 7 and 10 days before your deadline, we can complete the language editing at a rush rate. For academic review, we must receive it between 12 and 17 days before your deadline. The rush rate for each is \$875.

## ADDITIONAL FEES

### Shortening

If your proposal exceeds 10,000 words, we can help cut the length by up to 10% at an additional charge of \$230 that will not be covered by your institution.

### Additional editing

If you need additional editing beyond 10,000 words, you will be charged an additional \$.07 - \$.09 per word not covered by your institution.

### Formatting references

If you need help formatting your references according to a specific style guide, this will incur an additional charge of \$.07 - \$.09 per word.
